

Kobe City University of Foreign Studies (KCUFS) cultivates the "global citizen" who various can participate in disciplines. including business, diplomacy, and education by utilizing the advanced foreign languages skills which are needed to effectively function modern, international in а society. Additionally, our students are educated with the skills and knowledge to make capable, competent, and flexible decisions. Founded KCUFS offers undergraduate, in 1946. doctoral degrees divided graduate and between the departments of English, Chinese, Russian, Spanish and International Relations. The undergraduate programs are

split between specializations in Languages and Literature, International Politics, Economics and Business, Multicultural Society, and Liberal Arts. KCUFS is the only public university of foreign studies in Japan and has a current enrollment of over 2,000. MUN and JUEMUN

What is a Model United Nations (MUN) Conference?



MUN is an academic simulation of the United Nations that includes debate, public speaking and international affairs. At a Model United Nations Conference, participants, who are referred to as **delegates**, are given the opportunity to represent different countries on different committees.

Delegates participate in discussions on issues ranging from peace and security, to economic and social development, to human rights, to environmental protection. Through these exchanges, delegates are able to develop and refine skills such as collaboration, decision-making, critical thinking and verbal communication.

During a MUN, delegates work together to create practical and innovative solutions to the issue they are discussing. These solutions are then incorporated into a plan called a working paper and then introduced to all delegates in the form of a Draft Resolution. The Draft Resolutions are then amended and voted on in hopes of passing and becoming a Resolution. While most MUN conferences only last a few days, delegates often leave more interested in international affairs, and become more aware, more educated and more thoughtful global citizens of the future.

What is Japan University English Model United Nations (JUEMUN)?

Japan University English Model United Nations, commonly referred to as *JUEMUN*, is an annual faculty-organized and student-run conference held in the Kansai region of Japan. Since its inception in 2010, JUEMUN has grown into Japan's premier English MUN experience for university students. JUEMUN participants come from places near and far, bringing an amazing array of backgrounds and perspectives, resulting in an exciting, engaging, and unforgettable simulation. Our 2023 conference will bring over 180 student delegates, 12 chairs, 35 volunteers and more faculty advisors, observers and local leaders from 12 universities.





JUEMUN was founded by Professor Craig Smith at Kyoto University of Foreign Studies (KUFS) and Professor Lori Zenuk-Nishide at Kobe City University of Foreign Studies (KCFUS) with the leadership and support of Professor Donna Tatsuki at KCUFS, who have combined their MUN experience of over 60 years to offer a unique and innovative learning opportunity for university students. The annual JUEMUN conference is hosted on a rotating basis between KUFS, KCUFS, and Notre Dame Seishin University.

Each JUEMUN agenda is chosen after careful deliberation by the organizing committee. These chosen agendas are always issues of great importance to the world that need to be addressed with comprehensive and innovative solutions. At each JUEMUN conference, participants experience cooperative hands-on learning, allowing them to confront an issue in English from the perspective of their assigned country.

Through these experiences in the conference committee sessions, participants develop an appreciation of differing viewpoints, the frustration of negotiation, the rewards of cooperation, and

a broader view of the human side of international relations and diplomacy. The dedicated conference support and guidance from JUEMUN faculty advisors as well as the knowledge and experience shared by invited speakers truly make each JUEMUN conference a professional and educational experience of the highest quality.





Delegates who **exclude**, **discriminate against**, **or harass** other delegates, chairs, volunteers or other conference participants on the basis of **language**, **nationality**, **gender identity**, **race**, **ethnicity**, **sexual orientation**, **ability or other social grouping** will be <u>immediately removed from the</u> <u>conference</u>. 
